**PURPOSE:** The student learns to determine various themes of stories.

## **Strategy 2 - Instructions for Using VARIOUS Themes**

- 1. Select a story with a recognizable theme (message or lesson).
- 2. After reading a story, review the story elements (see story mapping).
- 3. To complete the chart, fill in the story title and ask the student:
  - a. Who is the main character?
  - b. Where did the story take place (setting)?
  - c. What is the main character's problem?
  - d. How did the main character solve the problem?
  - e. What happened at the end (outcome)?
  - f. What is the theme of the story?
- 4. Add personal stories. The goal is for the student to recognize these themes outside of the story.
- 5. For additional information or as a study group, read the article written by Lord (2014), *Theme Comprehension:* Beyond the Details.
