<b>ABE</b>	Adult Basic English
<b>ABCD</b>	Agri-Business Child Development Head Start Center <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Funded by Dept. of Agriculture</li> </ul>
<b>AIS</b>	Academic Intervention Services
<b>ASIR</b>	Academic Services Intensity Rubric
<b>BAM</b>	Born After the Move <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Refers to young children recorded on a Certificate of Eligibility who were born after the qualifying move, so are currently not eligible to receive services from the Migrant Education Program.</li> </ul>
<b>BOCES</b>  <b>(CiTi)</b>	Board of Cooperative Educational Services <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• BOCES is the Lead Education Agency for the Long Island-METRO METS, Mohawk Regional METS, and Oswego METS.</li> <li>• <i>Note: Oswego BOCES changed its program name from “BOCES” to the Center for Instruction, Technology &amp; Innovation (CiTi).</i></li> </ul>
<b>BOLST</b>	Basic Oral Language Screening Tool <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• NYS-MEP assessment used with Out-of-School Youth</li> </ul>
<b>CIG</b>	Consortium Incentive Grant <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• NYS-MEP currently participates in two of the national incentive grants funded through the federal Office of Migrant Education</li> <li>• <i>iSOSY – Instructional Services for OSY and Secondary Youth</i></li> <li>• <i>IDRC – Identification &amp; Recruitment Consortium</i></li> </ul>
<b>CNA</b>	Comprehensive Needs Assessment
<b>CAMP</b>	College Assistance Migrant Program <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sponsored throughout the United States by the Office of Migrant Education</li> </ul>
<b>COE</b>	Certificate of Eligibility
<b>CR Part 154</b>	Commissioner’s Regulations Part 154 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Establishes the legal requirements for the education of English Language Learners in New York</li> </ul>
<b>CSPR</b>	Consolidated State Performance Report <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Annual report submitted by states to the U.S. Department of Education, including migrant education data</li> </ul>

<b>CTLE</b>	Continuing Teacher and Leader Education <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Tracking professional development/learning credits for certain teachers and paraprofessionals</li> </ul>
<b>DACA</b>	Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Enables certain people who came to the U.S. as children and meet several key guidelines, to request consideration for deferred action. Recipients are eligible for work authorization and other benefits. Need to reapply every two years.</li> </ul>
<b>DASA</b>	Dignity for All Students (The Dignity Act) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>New York State</li> </ul>
<b>easyCBM™</b>	Tradename of assessment tool used by NYS-MEP for ELA and Math
<b>DO</b>	Student who Dropped Out of a U.S. high school <i>during</i> the current School Year (September 1 <sup>st</sup> to August 31 <sup>st</sup> ). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The field for [Grade] remains the same (9-12) as when the student was in high school.</li> <li>The field for [Still in School] shows the “DO” code.</li> </ul>
<b>D+</b>	Student who Dropped Out <i>before</i> the current School Year <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>“D+” is the Grade used for students who dropped out of a U.S. high school before September 1<sup>st</sup> of the current school year.</li> </ul>
<b>EC</b>	Early Childhood
<b>ECA</b>	Early Childhood Academic Tool. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>NYS-MEP early childhood assessment</li> </ul>
<b>EDFacts</b>	U.S. Department of Education Initiative to collect, analyze, and promote the use of pre-kindergarten through Grade 12 data.
<b>ELA</b>	English Language Arts
<b>EL</b>	<b>EL:</b> English Learner
<b>ELL</b>	<b>ELL:</b> English Language Learner
<b>MLL</b>	<b>MLL:</b> Multilingual Learner
<b>ENL</b>	English as a New Language <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Formerly <b>ESL:</b> English as a Second Language</li> </ul>
<b>ESEA</b>	Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The law establishing funding for migrant education programs in each state</li> </ul>
<b>ESSA</b>	Every Student Succeeds Act <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This name refers to when the law (ESEA of 1965) was amended through P.L. 114-95, and enacted December 10, 2015.</li> </ul>

<b>HEP</b>	High School Equivalency Program <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sponsored throughout the United States by the Office of Migrant Education</li> </ul>
<b>HOLA</b>	High School Online Leadership Academy <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Online version of SOMLA used during the pandemic</li> </ul>
<b>HSE</b>	High School Equivalency diploma or program
<b>IEP</b>	Individualized Education Plan
<b>FY</b>	Funding Year
<b>GED®</b>	General Education Development diploma or program <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Note: In Fall 2022, New York State selected the General Education Development (GED®) to replace the Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASC™) as the primary pathway to a New York State High School Equivalency Diploma</li> </ul>
<b>ID&amp;R</b>	Identification and Recruitment
<b>IDRC</b>	Identification & Recruitment Consortium <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>One of two Consortium Incentive Grants NYS-MEP participates in</li> </ul>
<b>IMEC</b>	Interstate Migrant Education Council
<b>iOSY</b>	Instructional Services for OSY and Secondary Youth <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>One of two Consortium Incent Grants NYS-MEP participates in</li> </ul>
<b>LEA</b>	Lead Education Agency
<b>LEP</b>	Limited English Proficiency
<b>Level/Service Level</b>	Level of service intensity, as determined with the Academic Services Intensity Rubric
<b>MEP</b>	Migrant Education Program
<b>METS</b>	Migrant Education Tutorial and Support Services regional program centers
<b>MIS2000</b>	Migrant Information System <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Data collection system for NYS-MEP</li> </ul>
<b>MS/EdD</b>	Management Services for Education Data <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Company that created and supports the MIS2000 system</li> </ul>
<b>MSIX</b>	Migrant Student Information Exchange; National data collection system
<b>NASDME</b>	National Association of State Directors of Migrant Education
<b>NAC</b>	Needs Assessment Committee <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Part of the Comprehensive Needs Assessment process</li> </ul>
<b>NYS</b>	New York State
<b>NYS Ag&amp;Mkts</b>	New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets

<b>NYS-MEP</b>	New York State Migrant Education Program
<b>NYS-DOL</b>	New York State Department of Labor
<b>NYSED</b>	New York State Education Department
<b>NYSESLAT</b>	New York State English as a Second Language Achievement Test
<b>NYSITELL</b>	New York State Identification Test for English Language Learners
<b>MPO</b>	Measurable Program Outcome
<b>MOU</b>	Memorandum of Understanding agreement
<b>OME</b>	Office of Migrant Education <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• United States Department of Education</li> </ul>
<b>OS</b>	Out-of-School <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• “OS” is the grade used for students who attended and/or left school in another country.</li> </ul>
<b>OSY</b>	Out-of-School Youth <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Includes Dropout (DO, D+) and OS students.</li> </ul>
<b>P0 – P5</b>	Grades the NYS-MEP uses for preschool children <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Uses the letter “P” with the child’s age</li> </ul>
<b>PAC</b>	Parent Advisory Council <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is a Statewide PAC and each METS has a local PAC</li> </ul>
<b>PASS</b>	Portable Assisted Study Sequence
<b>PD</b>	Professional Development
<b>PII</b>	Personally Identifiable Information
<b>PPE</b>	Personal Protective Equipment
<b>PLC</b>	Professional Learning Community
<b>PFS</b>	Priority for Services
<b>PY</b>	Program Year

<b>RtI or RTI</b>	Response to Intervention <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Approach to academic intervention with three (3) Tiers.</li> </ul>
<b>QAD</b>	Qualifying Arrival Date
<b>SDP</b>	Service Delivery Plan
<b>SED</b>	State Education Department
<b>SIF</b>	Student Information Form <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Intake form used to confirm student enrollment and update needs assessment</li> </ul>
<b>SIRS</b>	School Information Repository System <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• NYS student data system</li> </ul>
<b>SOMLA</b>	SUNY Oneonta Leadership Academy
<b>SST</b>	Statewide Support Team
<b>SUNY</b>	State University of New York
<b>TASC</b>	Technical Assistance & Support Center for the NYS-MEP
<b>Title I, Part C</b>	Section of the Elementary and Secondary Act of 1965 that authorizes the migrant education program
<b>ToA</b>	NYS-MEP Theory of Action
<b>UPK</b>	Universal Pre-K
<b>US ED</b>	United States Department of Education <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Note: “US DOE” is the acronym for the United States Department of Energy</li> </ul>
<b>Web App</b>	On-line system that Migrant Educators use to enter data into MIS2000
<b>Z Enrollments</b>	Code used in the “Enrollment Type” field on MIS2000 to run a report of students who are missing their intake information.
