#### • The Family Initiative Coordination Services Project

The Family Initiative Coordination Services Project facilitates, supports, and develops parent involvement at all levels of the Early Intervention Program. The Family Initiative Coordination Services Project also offers an Early Intervention Partners Training Project which is held four times per year on a rotating basis in five different regions throughout New York State.

The Early Intervention Partners Training Project helps parents of young children with disabilities become involved in Early Intervention Program leadership activities. The training sessions provide information, resources, and skill-building activities designed to increase parent advocacy and leadership skills. Parents are encouraged to form working partnerships with early intervention professionals and policymakers. Interpreters can be available.
