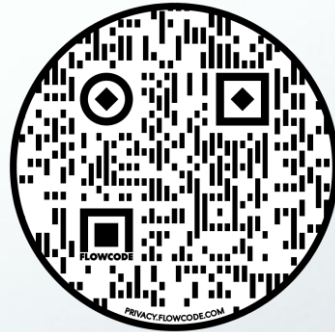

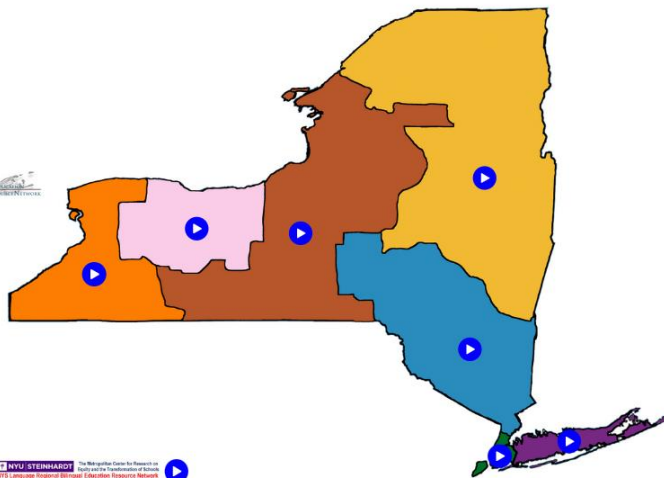

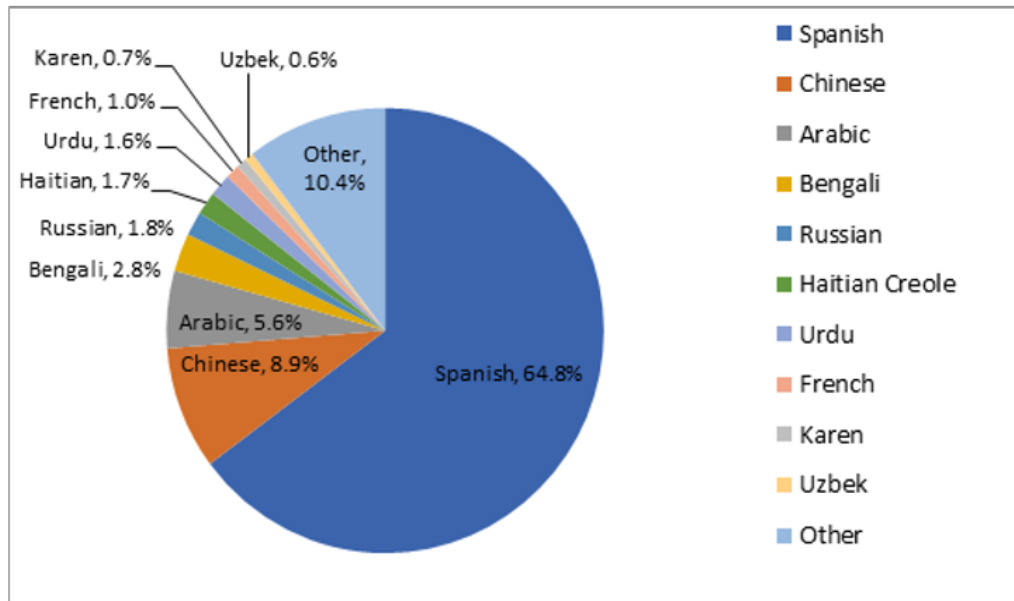

- + Not all English language learners are migrant students
- + Not all migrant students are English language learners
- + Not all migrant students **AND** not all English language learners speak Spanish

- + Encourage districts to have communication plan in place

- + Speak the languages of my students
- + Provide test accommodations for school and local tests
- + Serve as the sole communicator (translator & interpreter)
- + Sub as the teacher in a classroom
- + Work extensively with all Spanish speaking students

## PARENT BILL OF RIGHTS

- + Districts can NOT ask about immigration status
- + Right to an interpreter for critical interactions
- + Orientation to the school
- + Access to all programming and services
- + Bilingual education program if there are 20 or more students in one grade level who speak the same language
