


Connection to NYSED CR-SEF

But What If...

- Check your expectations: What are you expecting from the student?
- Student as the Educator: challenges become lessons
- Connect them with another trusting adult or partner with the student's "preferred adult" to rebuild that relationship
- Welcome the opportunity to apologize and reflect transparently
- Welcome forgiveness... it won't come easy
- Maintain a Trauma informed mindset and approach


