

Dear School Counselor,

Your student has been nominated to participate in the 2026 SUNY Oneonta Migrant Leadership Academy (SOMLA) this summer. Please see the enclosed flier for more information about the program. One college credit for *Transition Skills for Emerging Leaders (INTD 122)* will be granted to students who successfully complete SOMLA. As such, I am contacting you because SUNY Oneonta requires an **official** high school transcript to enroll the student and grant this credit upon completion. The official transcript must show that your student has successfully completed their sophomore year and show their final school year grades.

Our system for securely obtaining the transcript is outlined next. Please upload the transcript file to the [NYS Migrant Education Program's secure file-sharing service via Citrix](#). To do so, click the hyperlink, and you will simply be required to enter your name and email address before moving the file to our designated folder. Once a transcript is received from your office, Jocelyn will follow up with you to confirm receipt.

Please be advised that transcripts must come directly from the student's high school, prior to the arrival of students at SUNY Oneonta. The transcripts **must be signed by a school official** to be considered official. We kindly request that you **upload the transcript no later than July 2, 2026**, to avoid any holiday delays.

WHAT IS SOMLA

The SUNY Oneonta Migrant Leadership Academy (SOMLA) is a NYS-MEP summer program that provides eligible migrant students with the opportunity to learn about college, work possibilities, leadership qualities, and successful life strategies as they work towards graduating high school. Students explore various life skills, learn about leveraging their individual strengths and create a long-term plan to work on areas of personal growth that reflects their passions and interests. Students get to stay in residence halls just like traditional college students and have the chance to experience what life is like on campus!

Transportation to and from SUNY Oneonta and three meals a day will be provided (and of course, snacks, too!). But that's not all ~ There are other fun activities that you won't want to miss, and you will even have a chance to complete some community service hours for your high school and earn college credit!

WHY PARTICIPATE

INSTRUCTION - Take the opportunity to experience classes led by college professors and learn alongside other migrant students in a supportive environment.

LEADERSHIP - Learn about leadership and engage in activities that help you explore your own potential.

MENTORSHIP - Build relationships and receive one-on-one support from bilingual staff in small groups.

DID WE MENTION COLLEGE CREDIT? - One college credit will be granted to students for Transition Skills for Emerging Leaders (INTD 122) after successfully completing the program. This interactive course is designed to assist students in developing skills necessary toward ultimately obtaining a bachelor's degree. Students will learn critical skills to enhance success in college learning. Students will learn to systematically evaluate their own behavior, skills and attitudes that impact their academic outcomes.

WHO SHOULD APPLY

Currently eligible migrant students who will be in eleventh or twelfth grade in September 2026.

AND

Students who are willing to actively commit to academic, leadership, and service activities.
