

Step 1

Are you eligible to get the vaccine?



Find out online: The *New York State COVID-19 Vaccine Form* has an updated list of jobs, age, and other criteria, that qualify a person to be eligible to receive the vaccine. Go to the internet: <https://forms.ny.gov/s3/vaccine>

Note: The translation icon is in the top right corner of the screen.



Call to find out: Another option is to call one of the vaccination providers listed in Step 2, and ask if you are eligible to receive the vaccine.

Step 2

When you are eligible, make your appointment. You must have an appointment to receive the vaccination.

Community vaccination providers may include:

- Your healthcare provider.
- County Health Departments.
- Local pharmacies and hospitals.

Follow the instructions that they give you.

Step 2 continued

New York State has additional vaccination providers and locations.

To make an appointment, you can go online or call the COVID-19 Vaccine Hotline at 1-833-967-4829.



Making an appointment for a New York State provider online:

1. Use the following link: <https://am-i-eligible.covid19vaccine.health.ny.gov/>
Note: Language choices are in the top right corner of the screen. For Smartphones, click to open the MENU at the top for the language options.
2. Select the location and make your appointment. (*English-only*).
3. Complete the COVID-19 screening questions. (*English-only*).
4. Print the appointment confirmation or write the ID#, date, time, and location. Take this confirmation with you to your vaccination appointment.

Note: Giving an email address is optional. If you chose to give your email, the confirmation will go to your email.

Step 3

Complete the NYS COVID-19 Vaccine Form

Once you have an appointment, you need to complete the *NYS COVID-19 Vaccine Form*. You can complete the form online or answer the questions at your appointment.



When completing the NYS COVID-19 Vaccine Form online, answer the questions and follow the directions to create a **Submission ID**.

Step 4
What to expect on the day of your appointment

NYS COVID-19 Vaccine Form:

- If you completed this form online, show your **Submission ID**.
- Otherwise, you will answer the questions at your appointment.

You will be asked for:

- Identification
- Proof that you are eligible for the vaccination
- The appointment confirmation printout or the ID# (if you go to a New York State site)

You might be asked for Insurance information, but the vaccine is free. You do not need health insurance.

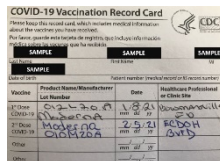
Second Dose

If your vaccine requires a second dose, they will give you another appointment date and time before you leave.

After the vaccination

You have to wait 15 – 30 minutes after the vaccination to make sure you do not have an allergic reaction.

You will receive your **COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card with your second appointment date, if applicable.**



Keep your card in a safe place!

- ★ The **COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card** is your record about the vaccination you received.
- ★ If your vaccine requires a second dose, you must take this Record Card to your second appointment.

Step 5
Vaccines requiring a second dose

It is important to receive the second dose if it is required. **Keep your appointment** and take your **COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card** to the appointment.

COVID-19 Vaccination Question and Answer

Is the COVID-19 vaccination free?
Yes, it is free. You do not need health insurance.

Should I continue to wear a mask and social distancing after I have the vaccination?

Yes. The CDC says it is important to continue to wear a mask, social distance 6 feet or 2 meters apart, and wash your hands regularly.
