NEW YORK STATE MIGRANT EDUCATION PROGRAM (NYS-MEP)



There eight regional are Migrant **Education Tutorial and Support Services** (METS) Program Centers in New York State, charged with providing direct educational programs and services to migrant children at homes and in schools. They also link migrant families with necessary academic, social, and health services and provide direct services to migrant families in the areas of academic assistance, advocacy, coordination with schools and community agencies, and other outreach activities.

Students who are eligible for services with the NYS-MEP automatically qualify for free lunch and breakfast at school. The first September after eligibility with the NYS-MEP ends, parents/guardians can complete the application from the school district to find out if their children continue to qualify for the free or reduced lunch prices or not.
