HISTORY

The CiTi BOCES Migrant Education Tutorial and Support Services Program (METS) began in 1983 to assist school districts in meeting the unique needs of migrant children. The program provides each child and family with individualized services to meet their needs. As one of eight Migrant Education Programs in New York State, we serve migrant youth in 36 districts in our four-county region.

ELIGIBILITY

Students (0-21) may be eligible if they have moved across school district or state boundaries within the last three years in order that they, a parent or guardian might secure or search for employment in agriculture.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

METS educators assess student needs and provide support or facilitate referrals in the areas of:

- Academic Support Services
- Health Services
- Family Literacy
- Advocacy and Outreach
- Referral Assistance

For preschool students, additional services provided may include:

- Referrals to preschool programs, where available
- In-home instruction to assist preschoolers in the areas of language development, reading, motor skills, Kindergarten readiness, etc.

For in-school students, additional services provided may include:

- In-school or In-home tutoring
- Educational field trips
- Free lunch eligibility

For out-of-school youth, additional services provided may include:

- In-home instruction to improve English language skills.
- High school equivalency instruction

PROGRAM SERVICES

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES/EVENTS:

- Educational Field Trips
- Graduation and Recognition Dinner
- Holiday Celebrations
- Family Educational Workshops

HEALTH SERVICES:

- Assist families with obtaining health insurance.
- Assist migrant students with obtaining immunizations.
- Assist families with migrant education funded health vouchers for eligible students.

- In-camp ESL Classes
